
Class Selection

Typically equates to 3x20 credit classes in Business or Humanities or combo of both *or* 4-6 classes in Engineering or Science depending on credit value of each class.




In order for students to have a personal academic advisor and 'belong' to a department/school, we require students to select at least 60% of their classes from one school/department.

- the business school is classed as a department.
- If you have a subject specific agreement, this should be the primary department.

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
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
