Are students required to have determined language skills in your language?	For the registration, we need proof for one language according to the main language of instruction. Should the student want to do courses in the other language, we ask for it when we sign the learning agreement. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Language of instruction = <b>GERMAN</b>: proof of language competence at least level <b>B1</b> (certificate of a school, university or language institute).</li> <li>• Language of instruction = <b>ENGLISH</b>: proof of language competence at least <b>B1</b> (certificate of a school, university or language institute).</li> </ul> Certificate must be issued in either English or German! High school certificates in other languages can only be accepted with an additional confirmation from the home university.
Does the number of students you are able to receive vary according to the number of students you will send?	No
Is the choice of modules restricted for ERASMUS+ students?	No, students can choose courses from different fields and faculties, if the places are available.
Final projects	Yes, if students are able to find a supervisor at TU Wien themselves; We do not offer such service. <b>Master</b> project: 30 ECTS <b>Bachelor</b> project: 5/10 - 12 ECTS

ECTS credits / workload	<p>ECTS credits are awarded based on the amount of effort required to complete each course. The official workload of a semester is comprised of 30 ECTS credits.</p> <p>Note: Please keep in mind that the average time taken by local students to complete their studies at TU Wien is <u>more</u> than the official length of studies (for Bachelor 6 semesters / Master 4 semesters). This means that the average workload is <u>less</u> than 30 ECTS credits. A workload of 30 credits per semester or 60 credits per year should therefore be considered as more than an average Austrian student would perform during a year and means a very high workload, often impossible to complete.</p>
